'Europe 1956' Exhibit Theme Of Arts, Crafts

An exhibition and sale of European fine arts and crafts at the Little Gallery are being presented by Peggy de Salle. Gathered from six countries on her last trip abroad, there is to be seen a wide range of choice objects of art in various mediums.

Highlights of the show include paintings by Andre Poujet of Paris—bright abstracts inspired by American Indian cultures. Also, there will be excellent prints of lithographs by such artists as Picasso, Matisse, Rouault, Miro, Vlaminck and Cezanne.

FROM ITALY there are brilliant water colors by Severa, oils by Bergoli, Crippa and Peverelli. Included will be a distinguished group of enamels by Sauti, one of Italy's young designers.


From Austria and Germany there are metal crafts and beautiful jewelry—delicate pastels by Kontony and Casini, studies by Hans Jaenisch in rhythmic style of superb quality.

Fine old prints, wood blocks and water colors as well as a group of magnificent colored coats of arms representing the names of leading families of the 18th century have been brought from England.

The exhibition will continue through Nov. 10 from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m., Monday through Saturday.

A GROUP of subtle ceramics and delightful carved wood fantasies have come from Denmark. Other crafts include Italian leather with contemporary design and German stained glass panels.



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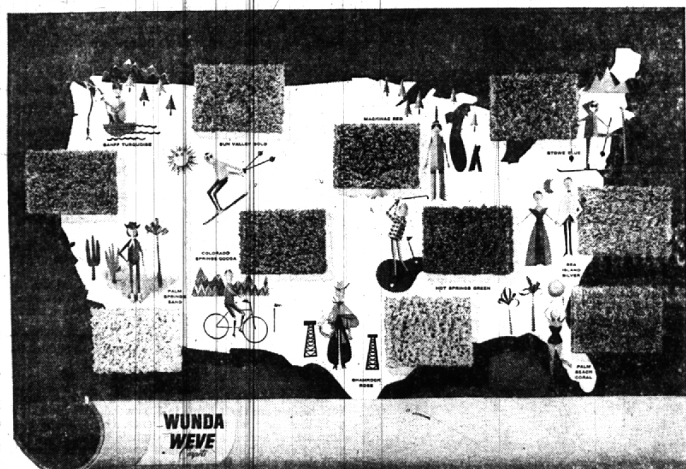
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
