

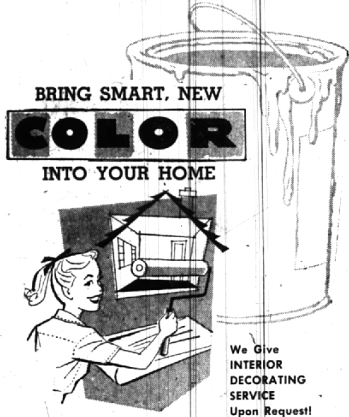
## Chatham Alumnae Meet Wednesday

A drive to keep order in Birmingham high school parking lots, both old and new, was launched this year by a registration of names and license numbers of everyone who drives to school.

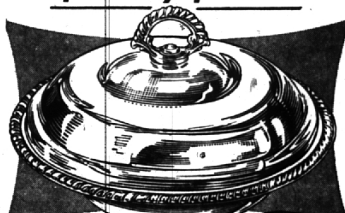

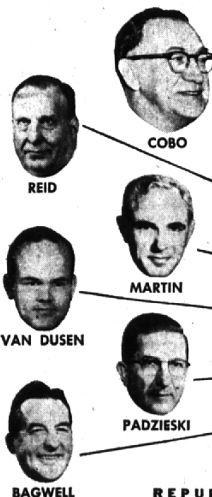
