BHS Varsity Club Elects Officers

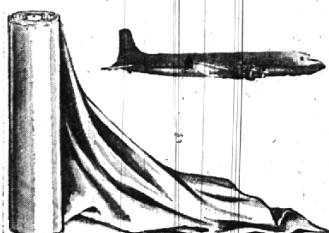
Last Monday night the Varsity club met to elect new officers for this semester.

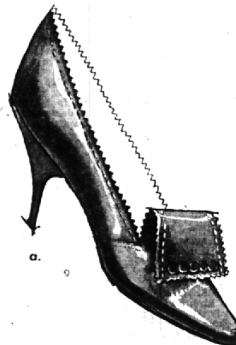
