Under direction of Robert Richards and Edward Taras, social studies teachers, students staged a second broadcast last Tuesday, presenting a program of election information.

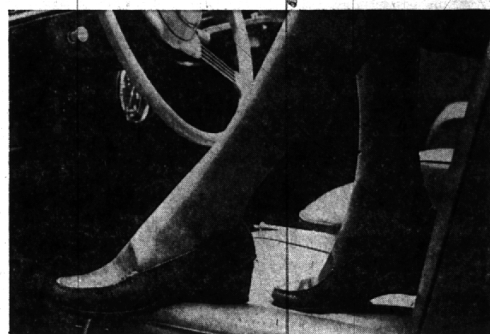
Today a fourth grade class from Quaker school put on a play on safety.

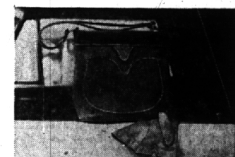
