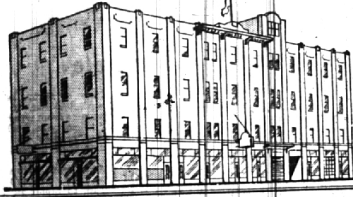

## Little Memorial Court Dedicated At North Church

An outdoor court honoring the memory of a Detroit family of North Congregational church members who were killed in a tragic automobile accident was dedicated Sunday.

The garden court, surrounded on all sides by the new church structure and containing an outdoor pulpit, has been named the Little Memorial court. It will be used for weddings and other small summer services at the church located at 10 1/2 Mile and North-western highway.

The court was given by friends of the John Little family of five, all of whom, according to the Rev. Ralph H. Read, "were very active in and devoted to the North church."

BARBARA CRAIG and Mary the Little children, were in their late teens and early twenties at the time of the fatal crash as the family was returning from a vacation trip several years ago. The three were interested in the church school and all youth activities.

Mr. Little had been a trustee of the church, and Mrs. Little was a deaconess and a member of the Tuesday Charities group. Friends of the family and the church who attended the ceremony Sunday remained for an afternoon tea, chaired by Mrs. George Snadden.

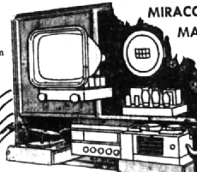

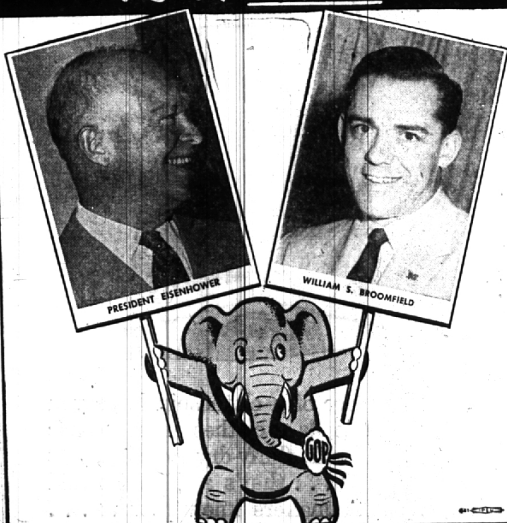
