Cranbrook School's football stock is dropping lower and lower in their league play and their public high school competition. The Crane attack was hindered by the absence of co-captain Herb Stanton who is out with a leg injury.

But the overall performance of the Cranbrook team was disappointing with poor tackling and weak blocking. This gives them a one win, three loss record for the year. CRANBROOK was able to make a score early in the third period when Chuck Grube broke through from his end position and blocked a Reserve punt on the 35. They marched down to the five on three running plays. Dave Cooper stepped back and passed to his right end, Hank Bartholme in the end zone for the score. 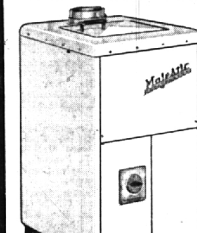
