Recreation Survey In Fourth Week

Bob Girardin is less stressed than he was at this time last week. "The Birmingham Eccentric's" article (outlining my need to get more information on the recreational desires of residents) has shown favorable results — but I don't want the community to stop now," the city's recreation director said Tuesday.

He urged the recreational questionnaires be filled out and returned. The representative sampling, now in its fourth week, will continue another six weeks so every section of the city is contacted by mail.

GIRARDIN SAID questionnaires have yet to be mailed to the southern and western city areas. "This survey," Girardin explained, "is aimed at a long-range plan for development of Birmingham recreational facilities. Its goal is to determine what you as residents would like us to plan for your leisure activities."

"It also is aimed at a more efficient use of recreation board recreation funds. A long-range plan is a must if either of these objectives are to be obtained."

He said anyone may obtain a questionnaire by contacting his office at the municipal building.

Steel Door Plans No Expansion Here

Steel Door Corp., 2400 E. Lincoln, will not make any plant expansions in Birmingham, Glenn Berry, company president, announced this week.

Any further expansion will be done at its Canadian or Georgia plants, he said. In explaining why the company has placed five areas of adjoining property on the market for \$85,000.

He said he already has turned down purchase offers from two persons who want to erect concrete batching plants.

THE LARGE tract includes a 297x135-foot piece recently acquired from the city of Birmingham for \$25,000.

Steel Door was in the process of making the purchase from the city when the no-expansion decision was made, but it was felt the sale should be completed, Berry said.
