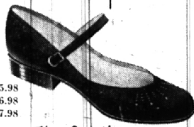

JOSEPH asked his father to be best man and ushers were Leon W. Ball, Stephen C. Ball, Thomas Stevens and Salvatore Palazolo.



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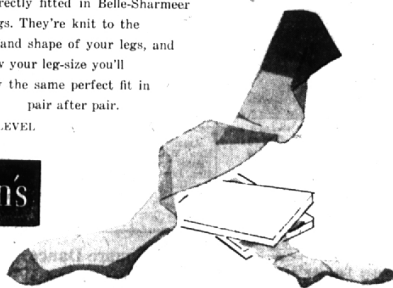

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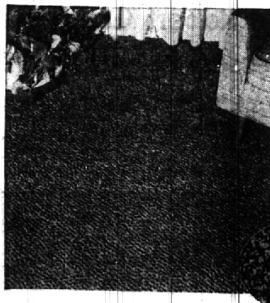
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
