NOW TELL THEM that they are going to write the story of their former life on earth and have them write, "I was \_\_\_\_\_ of \_\_\_\_\_." Fifth writes "Was in love with \_\_\_\_\_ and then fills in any name.

This can go on as long as the hostess can think up subjects for them to write. Finally, papers are unfolded and read.
