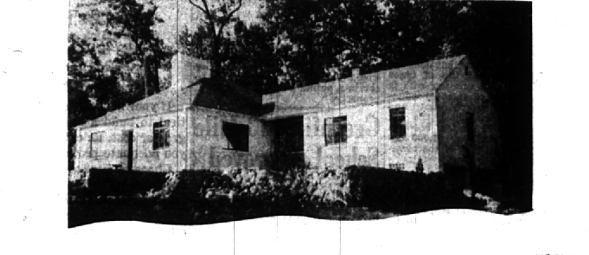
Slayden Programs 'Fall Fancy' Show

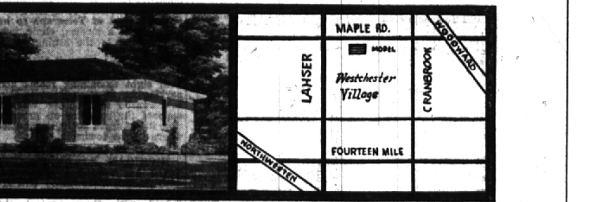
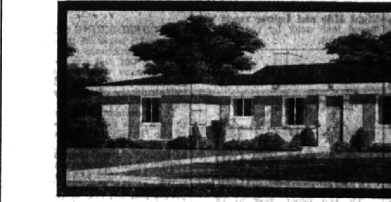
