3-Year Refuse Contract Gets Tentative OK

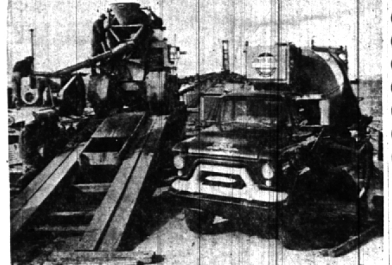
Although most of its municipal neighbors are collecting their own garbage and rubbish, Birmingham still may use a private contractor for another three years.

City commissioners looked at bids for 1957 service, decided the price looks good enough to consider a three-year contract. They instructed the city attorney to draw up an ordinance amendment to permit this additional time. Such contracts presently are restricted to one year.

Eugene H. Rutenber, Birmingham Trucking Co. wants \$45,000 for a one-year contract, or \$189,340 on a three-year basis. Present hauler, Commercial Removal Co., bid \$75,920 and \$242,760.

PAINTER & Rutenber has selected refuse from Gruesse Point Woods, Harper Woods and Detroit.

Rear door garbage collection still may be obtained at an extra \$10.76 annual charge.
