## Dr. Robert Hatt To Be Advisor To Pakistan

CRANBROOK — "On loan to UNESCO at the request of the government of Pakistan, Dr. Robert T. Hatt, director, Cranbrook Institute of Science, left this week with Mrs. Hatt.

After a stop-over in Paris this weekend, they will proceed to Karachi, where Dr. Hatt will be advisor to the Government of Pakistan on new science museums being established in Karachi, Lahore and Dhacca.

Dr. Hatt, who will work for four months under the technical assistance program of UNESCO, will be followed by an architect assigned to design and build the museums. James H. Carmel has been named to be acting director during Dr. Hatt's absence.

Trustees have announced election to their membership of Professor Leo Goldberg, director of the University of Michigan observatory, and H. Lynn Pearson, chairman of the board, Detroit Harvester company.

At the same time the board acted to close institute membership temporarily, because of inadequacy of auditorium facilities for membership programs and lectures.

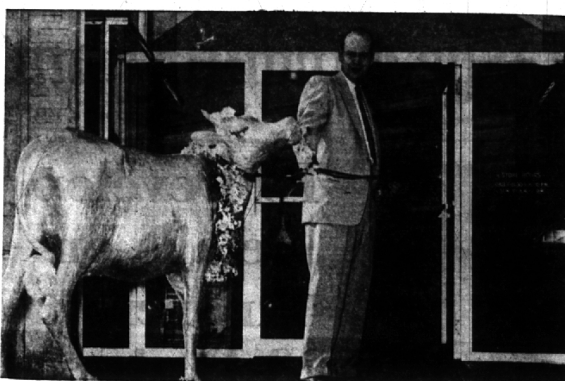

## Boys Suggest Junior Civil Defense Plan

Two small Birmingham boys this week appeared before the city commission to request permission to organize a junior civilian defense program here.

Peter Jackson, 11, and Gordon Willett, 10, explained their proposal to city commissioners, and were told that Civil Defense Director Robert Kenning would see just how their suggestion could be fitted into the program here.

Peter and Gordon told how they were interested in a national civil defense suggestion that boys and girls could help their country by volunteering for messenger service, stretcher-bearers, typists, etc.

SAID GORDON, whose mother, Mrs. Florence Willett, was sitting in her official place at the commission table: "We think children our age should know what to do in case of an emergency, and know first aid."

Peter suggested that school room captains could be selected, given a first aid course, then return to their schools to teach their classmates.

Commissioner Charles Renfrew asked Kenning to see if any other community has established a junior phase of civil defense.

Several weeks ago, Kenning accepted applications from two Baldwin elementary school boys who wanted some civilian defense jobs.

James J. Nance, Lone Pine road, Bloomfield Hills, will receive \$250,000 a figure agreed upon after general manager of Studebaker-Packard Corp. Aug. 6.

Nance's resignation from the \$150,000 a year salary which he will draw until Jan. 31, was part of an agreement by Curtis-Wright Corp. to give the independent auto firm a financial boost.

Besides waiving all salary rights and options to buy company stock, Nance will forfeit all benefits if he should go to work for a competing employer. Nance also will acquire \$600,000 in insurance policies carried on his life.

## 2 Bike Accidents Reported, Safety Program Continues

In a week which saw two minor accidents involving children on bicycles, Birmingham police visited Pierce school for the second of a series of school inspections in their bike safety program.

Le. Henry Timm and Det. Sgt. Robert Schaile estimated that over 400 children turned out Saturday to receive reflectorized tape for their bikes, stand inspection, and try out for prizes. There were 132 bike licenses issued.

Birmingham Kiwanians again assisted with the project. No injuries resulted from the bicycle accidents. Anthony Oaks, of Royal Oak, was struck by a car Thursday as he crossed an alley on his bike near S. Woodward and Bannaville.

In another accident, Nancy Kachaurian, 10, of 1604 Henrietta, dropped her bike and ran in panic when she saw an approaching car Thursday as she crossed at Maple and Henrietta. The oncoming car damaged the bicycle.

## Deposits Required

Birmingham's building code now contains several new provisions regulating relocation of old buildings. Principal changes call for a \$500 deposit to cover damages resulting from the moving, and a \$1,000 deposit to insure completion of the building on the new site within six months.

A Royal Oak man, already awaiting examination on charges of uttering and publishing in another Oakland county municipality, was sentenced to 30 days in Oakland county jail Friday by Birmingham Municipal Judge John J. Gaff. Marion Lee Langford, 24, was charged here with simple larceny.

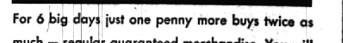
