Players Stage Crew Has 14 Scene Shifts

While most little theater groups and stock companies simplify Broadway's version of "The Solid Gold Cadillac," Birmingham Village Players are doing just the opposite in their production which will be presented the weekends of Oct. 19-20 and Oct. 26-27.

By refusing to skimp on the sets, veteran Director Albert Klingensmith, of 374 Lakeside, has ruled out the common practice of employing plain drapes and has added several other touches from his bag of tricks collected in nearly 30 years of stagecraft.

WITH 14 scene shifts in the play, the brunt of the work falls on the Players' stage crew, supervised by Douglas A. Brown, of 1865 Pierce. But, because of mechanical innovations, they will be able to change sets so quickly that it will

be only a matter of seconds between scenes. Also, instead of simplifying the television sequences in the Broadway production by changing them to radio scenes, the Players will use a different approach by setting up an actual TV studio on stage with specially-built TV equipment. In addition to special music, the "Cadillac" will differ from other Detroit area productions in that there will be both a surprise opening and surprise ending in this first public show of the Players' 34th season at their Chestnut street Playhouse.

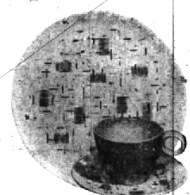
