It is our belief that a long growing season is ahead and the suface of the soil will be cool and that plenty of moisture will be available. (Did you know that if a grass seed germinates on dry ground it will die in two hours?)

Nature also has the fertilizer ready in that the dead leaves, grass, etc. have been rotting constantly and are giving up their nutrients. We can't wait on this so we have to put on some man-made food.

This is all there is to it—except work and thoughtful attention to a few small details such as growing, watering, aerating, weed killing, et cetera.

NOW! ON TO BRIGHTER ACTIVITIES
