DOWN TO EARTH Frontdoor Flowers Add Warmth

This week I could still detain you in Cleveland as I did last week to give you some fine ideas I observed there.

It is common practice in Cleveland to incorporate well chosen annuals with the foundation planting. In our town there is definitely two opposite schools of thought on the good taste of incorporating color with the foundation planting.

Weighing the effect objectively I am inclined to be on the side of incorporating color with foundation plantings. It gives the same warmth to the total effect of a home's appearance as the person who isn't afraid to nod and smile to strangers denoting that a warm hearted person "lives here."

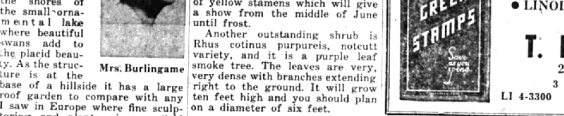
Also while in the Cleveland area I spent a great deal of time at the nurseries north of the city where many of our finest plants for the midwest are grown. Of course my first query was: "What is new?"

Walking through the fields I fell in love with the rugose rose: Frau Dagmar Hartopp. It has heavily veined dark green leaves and not only does not have blackspot in its history but is disease resistant.

It is appropriate to use as a low hedge about two feet high. It will do very well in sandy soil and loves a lake habitat, but you will like the pink flowers with an abundance of yellow stamens which will give a show from the middle of June until frost.

Another outstanding shrub is Rhus cotinus purpurea, notcut variety, and it is a purple leaf smoke tree. The leaves are very dense with branches extending right to the ground. It will grow ten feet high and you should plant on a diameter of six feet.

Between the Garden Center and the shores of the small lake is a lounging area made up of Plane



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
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
