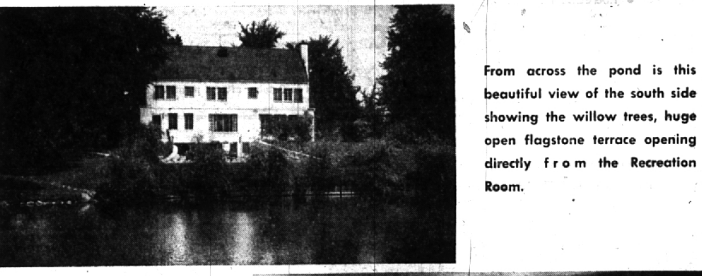

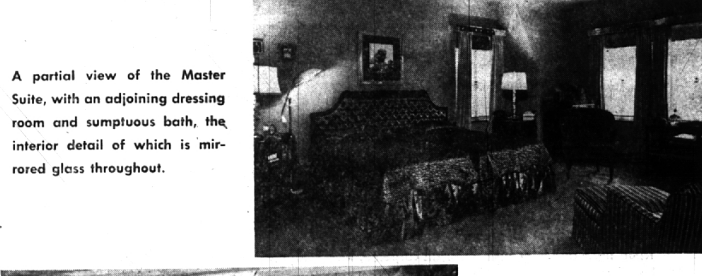
Left is a view of the front of the residence, showing the outdoor grille, and the patio as well as the circular rose garden.
