New Edison Station Offers More Power In South Oakland

A new Detroit-Edison transformer and switching station, now under construction at Coolidge and 14 1/2 Mile roads in Royal Oak, will provide another high-capacity source of electric power for a 35-square-mile area in Southeastern Oakland County.

Howard L. Canfield, manager of Edison Oakland district, said the new station, which is scheduled for completion in the fall of 1957, will step down supply line voltage from 120,000 volts to 40,000 volts for local distribution. It will feed substations serving Birmingham and parts of Royal Oak, Troy, Bloomfield and Southfield towns.

Canfield said that the project, which has been prompted by the rapidly increasing use of electricity in the area, will also include the construction of new 40,000-volt distribution lines and the re-routing of several supply lines. Revised, the electrical system will have shorter transmission distances and will provide for future expansion of the electric power supply.

SUBSTATIONS in the area now receive power from Pontiac's Bloomfield Station and Lincoln Station in Royal Oak. Canfield pointed out that the shifting of the electrical load from the present sources to the new station will make more electric power available for use in other Oakland County communities. Canfield said, "Historically, electrical use in Detroit-Edison's service area has doubled at about ten-year intervals. However, Oakland County has exceeded this rate, increasing its use from 500,858,000 kilowatt-hours in 1950 to 1,029,557,000 kilowatt-hours in 1955—more than 100 per cent in just five years! This skyrocketing in the use of electrical energy can be traced to increased use by individual residential customers as well as population growth and increased commercial and industrial requirements.

"These ever-increasing needs are being met with many new installations like that now under construction at Coolidge and 14 1/2 Mile roads."

IF YOU ARE not sure that worms are the difficulty, seek professional advice. There is no known way to protect against worms. We can only cure the animal once he does get worms. But with other diseases it is possible to apply preventive techniques by having the animal vaccinated.

The earlier people have puppies vaccinated against infectious diseases the better. There are some vaccinations that can be given at three months of age, and some that can be given even earlier. There are some dog owners who think these injections cannot be given safely until the dog "comes of age" at six months.

THEY ARE mistaken. The six months date is only for licensing purposes. There is nothing which says a dog cannot be safely inoculated for rabies and other diseases before that time. The veterinarian will give you a certificate which can be used later when the dog's license is applied for.

The confusion apparently has arisen because in some Michigan counties dogs must receive rabies shots before they can be licensed. These include Wayne, Oakland, Cass, Eaton, Kalamazoo and Washtenaw counties at present. Dogs must be licensed at six months of age, and usually yearly thereafter.

Car Owners: Watch For Trunk Looters

Because Birmingham police have received reports of numerous thefts of tires and wheels from automobile trunks, Detective I. L. Merlin Holmquist this week warned residents to keep car trunks locked.

Holmquist said most of the tires and wheels are being taken from late model vehicles in parking lots and near residences.

He advised car owners to check trunk locks carefully, and to report any suspicious cars to police.
