Construction or improvement of 32 downtown Birmingham alleys has been recommended to the city commission by City Planner Herbert Herzberg.

Top 10 are: Fernside-Park new; already set up in a special assessment district. Forest-Woodward (new; right-of-way has just been negotiated and purchased). Bates-Maple (new; under discussion for 2½ years; commission this week called for land cost estimates on two plans—an "L" shaped alley between Bates and Martin, the other a "straight-in," dead-end alley from Bates eastward).

PARK-WOODWARD (new; would serve recent commercial construction). Island View street vacation (would permit parking lot behind recent commercial construction on N. Woodward).

Block bounded by Woodward, Hamilton, Hunter and Maple (improvement). West Woodward frontage, Lincoln to Bird (improvement). East Woodward frontage, Ruffner to Sheffield (improvement). Rear of Wakelee building (new; would mean vacation of present mid-block exit onto Willis). Block bounded by Woodward, Maple, Brownell and Forest (new).
