## B'ham Students To Be 'On the Air' More

Birmingham students will be on the air this year for six times as much programming as in previous years. Mrs. Monzelle Clark, director of the Birmingham schools' radio speech department, announced this week that two programs will be broadcast every week, including school holiday weeks, over commercial stations.

Programming gets underway with the first of the weekly school broadcasts over radio station UPON Tuesday, Oct. 2, from 11 to 11:30 a.m. A fifteen-minute broadcast will be heard Thursday, Oct. 4, and each succeeding week over WCAR at 10:30.

**FEATURED ON THE INITIAL UPON** show will be a report on the summer trip from three members of Birmingham high school instructor Eugene Hubbard's European touring group. Judy Kinnip, Beverly Ford, Sarah Hogan and Mr. Hubbard will be on hand to tell their travel experiences as they answer a parent's queries from Mrs. Berrien Ketchum. Leading off the WCAR series the following Tuesday will be the high school advance radio speech classes, a radio adaptation of O. Henry's "Mammon and the Archer," by Mrs. Monzelle Clark. The broadcasts are an outlet for their creative talent," Mrs. Clark said, "and at the same time they explain to parents the work the students are doing."

**THE THURSDAY** broadcasts, Mrs. Clark said, will be devoted to short dramatic plays, all of which will be tied in with the students' curriculum. The last two Tuesday programs each month will be devoted to music. Music students from each of the Birmingham high schools will be heard twice during the year. The music programming, under Arnold W. Bernitt, supervisor of music in Birmingham schools, is intended to demonstrate how the students learn.

**NEWS COVERAGE** on other Tuesdays will relate "anything interesting to teen-agers," Mrs. Clark said. For example, Don Thacker and Sue Tabor, Birmingham high school students who spent last summer with European families on the American Field Service student exchange program, will report on their experiences abroad. Birmingham high school's two foreign exchange students will also be interviewed on another show.

Second Tuesday of every month will be devoted to panel discussion on current events, under the sponsorship of the high school social studies department.

Thursday programs will be transmitted via a telephone line "live" from the high school for broadcast over WCAR. Tuesday programs will be taped in the high school's Little Theatre for rebroadcast. All programs will be directed and supervised by Mrs. Clark.

**THROUGH PUBLIC** address systems in all Birmingham schools, with the exception of Pierce, the broadcasts can be transmitted to school students. Pierce students will be able to hear the programs on several radios maintained at the school.

Plans are ready and a contract has been awarded for new broadcast studios at the high school. Mrs. Clark revealed. One-half of a large art room in B building will be converted to contain a classroom, two studios and a control room.

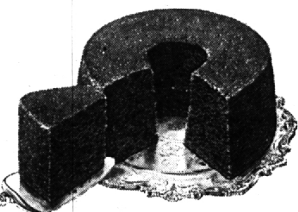

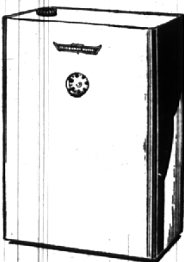
