Police Begin Safety Inspection Of Bikes at Birmingham Schools

As the Birmingham police department's official bike inspections got under way Saturday, approximately 350 youngsters turned out at Torry school for a safety check and Scotchlite tape on their two-wheelers. Birmingham Kiwanians, cooperating with police on the bike safety program, provided and applied white tape to the front and rear fenders of the bikes. Kiwanians also provided prizes which were awarded to 20 young cyclists who demonstrated skill and safety awareness in riding their bikes over an obstacle course.

REPRESENTING Birmingham police at the inspection were Lt. Henry Timm and Detective Sgt. Robert Schaula, who showed the school's students a film on bike safety the previous day. The same film will be shown this week to Pierce school children, with the next bike inspection scheduled there Saturday at 9 a.m. Other schools will be visited during forthcoming weeks. Kiwanians purchased the film on bike safety for Birmingham police use several years ago. They have also furnished police with notices advising children and their parents of the scheduled bike inspections.

KIWANIANS Richard "Hot" Gibson, Pete Russo, Mark Elliott and President Gilbert Schrock were on hand last week to assist police in inspecting bikes and tagging those found to be unlicensed. Schaula said 81 licenses were issued Saturday in compliance with a Birmingham city ordinance requiring licensing for owners' protection.

Inter-school entertainment for this first event on the school's social calendar was provided by the Staxians, one of the Cranbrook bands.

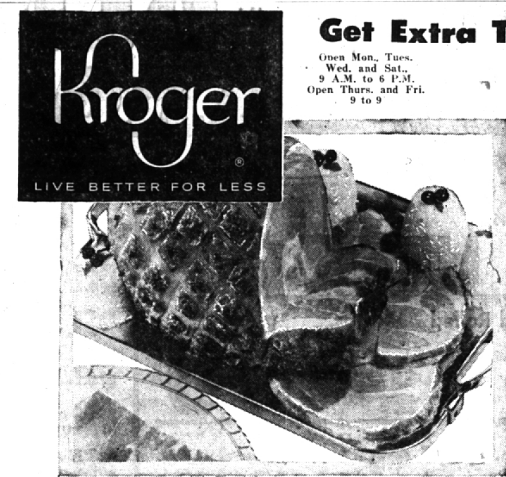

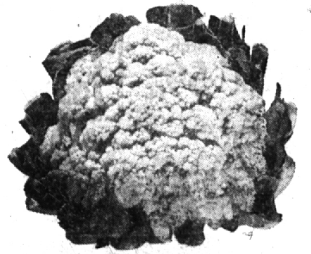

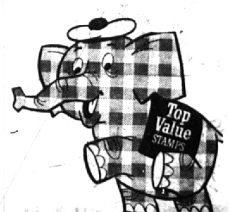
