

Bible, Science To Be Studied At 1st Baptist

"Modern Science and Ancient Scripture" is the theme of the ninth annual Bible institute to be held Wednesday evenings during October at First Baptist church.

Many modern folk fail to realize the timely and timeless quality in the Bible. There is a striking, sometimes startling, relevance of Bible teaching to our scientific generation," said the Rev. Dr. Emil Kuntz, pastor of the church, in announcing the institute.

Subjects to be discussed include the Bible and modern science, archeology, psychology, history and sociology.

Rev. Dr. Robert A. Macoskey, assistant pastor, will assist Dr. Kuntz. Both pastors have made special studies in these fields in this country and abroad.

Born in 1913 in Detroit, Fr. Filipowicz was appointed dean of St. Mary's college in 1945, the position

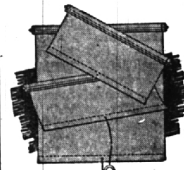
he held at the time of his appointment. His sister, Mrs. Marie Slatsky resides in Southfield township.
