What Is Rug Shading?

Sometimes a rug may seem to change color in certain areas. When you look at a rug from one angle, these spots seem lighter than the rest, but when you walk around the other side they seem darker. This condition is called shading and is a normal phenomenon and is in no way a fault of the manufacturer or the cleaner, states the National Institute of Rug Cleaning, Inc.

When all the tufts in a rug slant in the same direction, there is no shading, but often some tufts slant against this normal pile lay. This causes a variation in the way light is reflected from the nap, and is shading.

Shading can sometimes be corrected by professional cleaning. Once in awhile shading may seem more pronounced after cleaning. The light reflectance difference did not appear on the rug immediately before because the fibers were matted with a thick coat of dirt and soil.
