APRIL TIDBITS

1. If you are so anxious to cultivate the garden be careful of the HIDDEN tips of lilies and other bulbs.
2. As soon as perennials, particularly peonies, start to grow dust them and the ground from which they emanate with BORDEAUX.
3. Plant ROSES now!
NOTE:—When you see something in capital letters it means we have it for sale. This does not apply to APRIL TIDBITS (which we have to pay for) or to HIDDEN in paragraph No. 1.
4. PRUNE roses immediately (no, we don't sell prunes) cutting back to live wood—and still further if a few special blooms are desired. Try to have the top bud pointing outward.
5. Delphinium can be divided as soon as growth begins. Large clumps are not necessary — three good crowns with a well-developed root are sufficient.
6. Get at your lawn fertilizing as quickly as you can. A few tips:—
A. Two pounds of Agrico, Gro-Sod or Staders XXX (all 10-6-1) per 100 square feet.
B. Don't roll if surface dirt is wet.
C. Seed anytime after fertilizing.
D. In thin places rake a bit even if some plants are destroyed. After seeding rake it in, tamp lightly and cover with a thin layer of PEAT MOSS.
7. PATIO BLOCKS in seven colors can give you a lovely ah-well, patio. The blocks are 8 by 16 inches, easy to lay and only \$1.00 for three.
8. ASPARAGUS roots are available. You may have to wait until you can dig a trench about a foot deep. Boy! That cold asparagus tip salad!!
9. We are still having trouble finding enough room for storing SPREADERS to loan to you. Be smart and buy one. You'd be surprised how popular you will be.
10. Watch out for burning when using the dormant spray SCALECIDE. If leaves are out or the buds have burst the strength should be reduced or the spray eliminated.
11. A good time to prune evergreen hedges such as arborvitae, boxwood and yew. Remove only last year's growth—UNLESS you are an expert.
12. Good night.

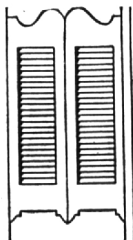
