McAlpine, local surveyor and map maker. He probably knows more about local and other Oakland county land surveys than any other person. "Well, several years ago I found that at Adams and East Maple the land is 765 feet above sea level, and at Woodward and Maple 780 feet," said Wilbur. The Detroit River is 572 feet above sea level. Therefore, if we average Birmingham at 772 feet, we find that it is 204 feet higher than the Detroit River . . . which probably puts us about 200 feet higher than Detroit's Grand Circus Park.
