

Say New 'Y' Unit Requires No Zone Reclassification

Birmingham city planners recommended denial of the local Y.M.C.A. petition for a multiple family zoning classification to permit construction of the first unit of a new building.

The planners acted after consulting City Attorney Richard Adams. The Y.M.C.A. is an elementary institution, Adams told planners, and under its present income bungalow classification, use of the property at Lincoln and Floyd streets for such purposes is already permitted.

A number of property owners in the Y.M.C.A.'s immediate area appeared at last week's informal hearing to protest possible future use of the property for a dining room or dormitory.

A nearby property owner complained that lack of off-street parking at the Y.M.C.A. sometimes causes traffic jams near the building which inconvenienced residents in the area.

Y.M.C.A. Executive Secretary said no plans for off-street parking were included with the first construction, slated to begin this fall. There is still room in the timonastics class now forming, to under instruction of Edwin F. Kirbert and George Ewing. Starting May 3, the class meets from 7 to 3 p.m. Fridays, through June 7.
