Co-hostesses will be Mrs. Walter Morris and Mrs. Harry Erickson. Annual reports will be read followed by the election of officers.

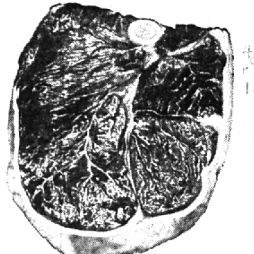
Organizational Meeting Planned

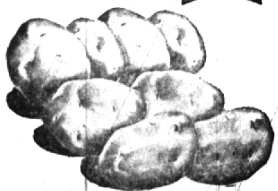
