Bloomfield 4-H Club Members Win County Honors



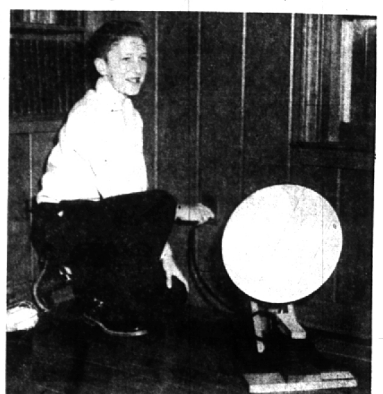

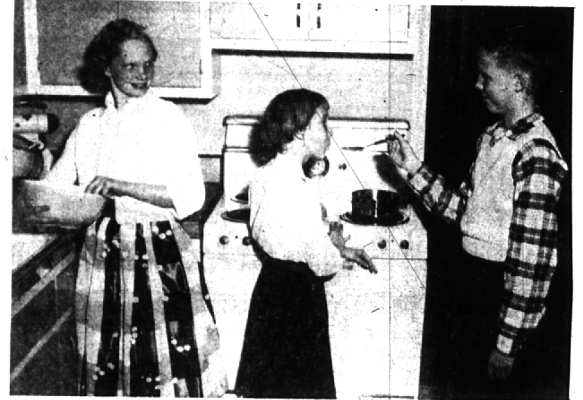
