DR. HOWE HAS BEEN professor of Pastoral Theology at the Protestant Episcopal theological seminary in Virginia, He is active in the educational programs of other denomina-tions as well, and in educational work generally, as lecturer, conference leader, consultant and writer.

During his 18 years of teaching, Dr. Howe has been counselor to many people besides students, especially in the area of family relations.

A major area of his interest is correlation of Gospel insights with insights of the social and medical sciences.
