Sale of 'City Tree' Is WNFGA Project

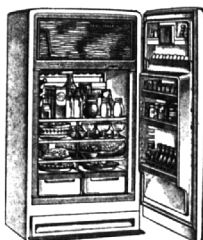

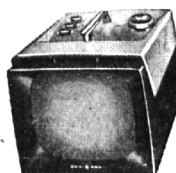
