Honors Go to Ethyl Corp.

Scales, who is general manager of Ethyl's research laboratories at 1600 W. Eight Mile Road, explained that the corporation was one of about 2,000 companies which took part in a "register and vote" campaign sponsored jointly by the American Heritage Foundation and the Advertising Council.

more than 96 per cent of Ethyl's 6,000 employees cast their ballots last Nov. 6.

"The personal approach proved most successful in encouraging our people to perform their civic duty," Scales said. Ethyl's management used all of its advertising and promotional know-how to urge its own people and many others to vote.

"LETTERS to employees' homes told of approaching registration deadlines. Then, a few days before the election, employees got a personal letter from Ethyl's board chairman and its president. On election day, employees' children and Boy Scouts handed out last-minute reminders at the company's locations in Detroit, New York, Baton Rouge, and Houston.

"To help influence as many other people as possible, Ethyl used bumper strips on its cars and

trucks, posters in its various locations and on its taskbars, special postage-meter legends on its outgoing mail and, in addition, mailed more than 70,000 reprints of its cartoon series on voting duties to about 30 different companies."
