

Cantonese Tuna

- 1 1/2 cup Solid Dressing
- 1 1/2 cups hot medium cream sauce
- 1 6-oz. can Bonito Chicken Tuna
- 2 tablespoons minced onion
- 1 can Dill Pickle Relish
- 1/2 can chopped pickled peppers
- 1/2 cup sliced mushrooms
- 1/2 cup sliced green onions

Gradually add the solid dressing to the cream sauce in the top of a double boiler and stir until thick. Do not boil and do not remove until thick.

Heat the pickles in a sauce pan and pour the tuna over them. Add the relish and onion and mix well.
