### Antique Store Razed

Toppled in lieu of a new two-story commercial building, this abandoned antique shop has for years been a familiar sight to Birmingham residents, located at the corner of Maple and Bates streets. Built during Civil War days, it was originally the home of Miss Jennie Keyes, until 1928, when for a brief year it was made into an undertaker's parlor. Since that time it has been an antique shop, owned by Mrs. Harry Allen, 556 W. Maple, and operated by Mr. and Mrs. Charles Taylor until 1952. Then the shop changed management to Mrs. L. B. Fjux and her daughter Mrs. W. M. Albee, who ran the store until 1955, since which time it has remained vacant. The store was razed by Woody Walker Construction company, the firm to build the new commercial structure.
