LATHRUP VILLAGE—Shan Pac, the "rags to riches" winner of the Louisiana Derby trials, leads a list of 17 eligibles for the third running of the Detroit Race Course's \$7,500-added Bull Dog Stakes, Saturday, Aug. 17.

T. A. Grison, 18191 Redwood, paid \$5,000 for Shan Pac at the famed Keeneland horse sales in 1955 and has since had to use an adding machine to total the winnings.

UNOFFICIAL EARNINGS of the horse, which won the \$10,000 Hazel Park Juvenile Championship last year, amount to approximately \$55,000 for 1956, according to Mrs. T. A. Grison.

MINUTES OF THE SPECIAL MEETING OF THE SOUTHFIELD TOWNSHIP BOARD HELD AUGUST 6, 1957.

Meeting called to order by Supervisor Swem.

PRESENT: Allerton, Costello, Lane, Maloney, Swem and Adams.

ABSENT: Hollywood.

This Special Meeting was called by Mr. Swem upon request and deposit of \$100.00 by Mr. Link, to act upon the recommendation of the Zoning Board of July 25th.

Notices were delivered to each member of the Board previous to the Meeting according to law.

Considerable discussion was held relative to the entrance to the property to be rezoned to parking. Mr. Link had not obtained from the State Highway Commission definite plans for control of traffic.

Mr. Swem advised that the Board should consider only the amendment to the Ordinance.

MOTION by Adams, seconded by Lane, that the following Resolution be adopted:

WHEREAS, the Township Board, on May 28, 1957, declared its intention of amending Zoning Ordinance No. 118 to rezone from Residential to "P" Vehicular Parking Classification, and referred the matter to the Zoning Board of Public Hearing, and,

WHEREAS, a Public Hearing was held on July 25, 1957 and the Zoning Board recommended to the Township Board, the adoption of said Amendment;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Township Ordains that Zoning Ordinance No. 118 of the Township of Southfield, adopted by referendum of the electors thereof on June 18, 1946 and known as the Zoning Ordinance as amended be amended in the following respects:

SECTION I

Rezone from Residential to "P" Vehicular Parking Classification, property described as:

Beginning at a point, said point being S 88° 34' 30" E, 665.0' (as recorded in deed) and N. 1° 13' 30" E, 301.14' and N. 88° 34' 30" W, 130.0' from SW corner of Section 33, T1N, R10E;

Thence N. 1° 13' 30" E, 299.55';

Thence S. 88° 46' 30" E, 37.28';

Thence N. 1° 13' 30" E, 306.11';

Thence N. 88° 08' 10" W, 100.00';

Thence S. 9° 42' 40" W, 151.41';

Thence N. 88° 08' 10" W, 114.17';

Thence along the easterly wall of the "Makay Building" (so called) and the extension thereof,

S. 6° 06' 50" W., 459.20';

Thence S. 88° 34' 30" E, 218.35' to the point of beginning.

Containing 2.674 acres, more or less.

SECTION II

That Zoning Maps be revised to conform to the changes as ordained.

SECTION III

This Ordinance shall take effect upon its adoption and legal publication.
