Adult Education Tops Younger Set

It may sound incredible, but it's true: this fall, more adults will be going "back to school" than all the children in the nation's kindergartens, elementary schools and high schools together!

Authorities estimate that about one in every three adults, or up to 50 million Americans, are currently taking part in this great, growing movement.

They meet and study in every conceivable setting — in public schools, universities and libraries; in business establishments, factories and union halls; in religious centers, clubrooms and community houses and volunteer agency headquarters.

Many learn right at home, taking courses from one of nearly 400 private correspondence schools.

At latest count, there are 5,000,000 part-time instructors and leaders in the movement, plus 100,000 full-time administrators, supervisors and field workers. More than 150 national groups and thousands of local ones are sponsoring some kind of educational activity.

Programs include tens of thousands of organized classes, public forums, lecture series, monthly club meetings, discussion groups, study circles, conferences, institutes and educational television stations.

People want to learn new skills so that they can start new businesses, get faster promotions or step into newer, better jobs. Or they want to improve their personalities for a wide variety of social and business reasons.

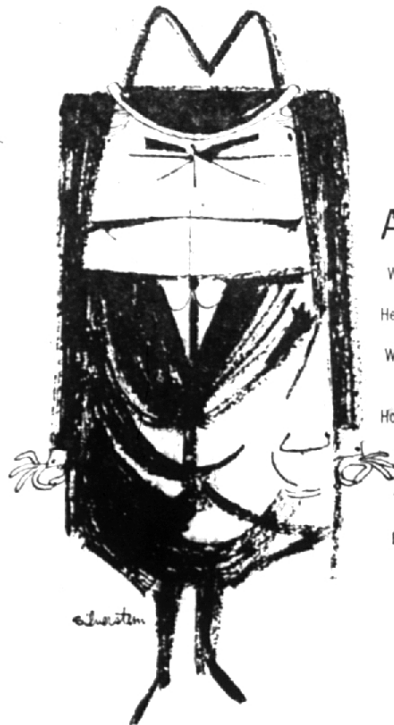

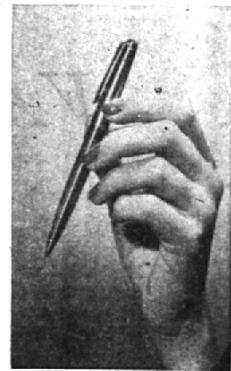
