Hills Police Crack Series Of Area House Burglaries

Traffic Safety Is Evaluated

An analysis of Birmingham's annual inventory of traffic safety activities, prepared by the National Safety Council, shows a percentage increase in four of its eight sections.

IN THREE of the eight sections considered, drops from the 1955 percentages were minor. Only one—traffic courts—showed a major percentage decrease.

IN TRAFFIC COURTS, the drop was from 68.6 to 58.0. The greatest increase was in safety organizations, which climbed from 15.0 to 54.0.

SEVERAL IMPORTANT recommendations were made by the safety council in three fields—traffic engineering, traffic courts and school traffic safety education.
