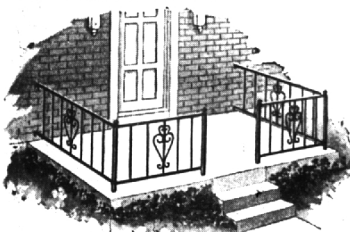


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Mantilla Accents Spanish Bridal Gown

On their return, the couple will reside on Foreman drive in Birmingham.

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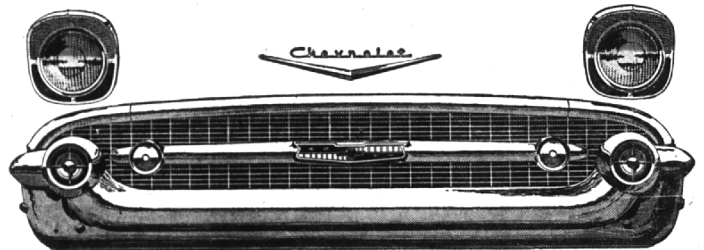
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
