

# Western Shore of Michigan Rich in History

Birmingham is situated in the number four tourist state in the nation and you need not go far to see why. Michigan, a state laden with sun, sand and scenery, creates an irresistible lure to the traveler.

Tucked neatly into the lap of the Great Lakes her historic past is fairly alive with romance. For up and down these water highways plowed the canoes of the voyageurs, the traders and the missionaries, men who probed deep into the Michigan territory long before it was anything but a highly inaccurate projection on equally inaccurate maps.

The Lake Michigan country, from its fertile fruit belt in the south to the Straits of Mackinac with its gigantic bridge under construction, is a prime example of various opportunities afforded.

FROM NEW BUFFALO and Michiana in South Michigan to the northern tip of the state, each village and city has its own legends of the days of the sailing ship.

At Warren-Dunes park just out of New Buffalo on US-12, the visitor can swim, sunbathe or reflect upon Father Marquette's reaction

and its cavernous rumbles beckons. Close by is Devil's Hole, a dune ravine where horse thieves once hid.

South Haven was a bustling international seaport before the St. Lawrence Seaway was dreamed of. Now its five miles of sandy beach and 40 nearby lakes make it a summer vacation center.

Old Bailey, one of Michigan's largest dunes, guards the approach to the artist colony of Saugatuck where James Fenimore Cooper long ago paused to gather material.

Nearby is the site of Singapore, old lumber town buried in shifting sands. In 1853 between the lives of Gen. B. D. Pritchard, captor of Jefferson Davis.

## Amend Swimming Pool Ordinance

LATHRUP — Council gave first reading to an amendment to the year-old swimming pool ordinance which they say needed clarification for interpretations by the zoning board of appeals.

Council changed the swimming pool law to require a brick, wood or masonry wall or a link fence with openings no larger than two inches must surround the pool.

Electrical wires which might pass over a pool must be rerouted or placed underground. And each pool must have at the entrance a self-latching gate.

Pools must be drained when unattended if the pools are not covered or drained.

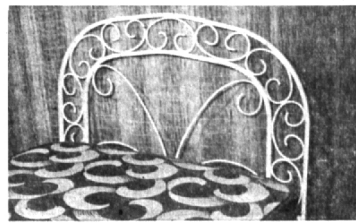
