25 Parking Lots Still Do Not Meet Ordinance's Terms

Of the 28 Birmingham businesses and organizations notified that they will have to surface their off-street parking areas or stop using them after Aug. 31, three made a move to comply last week.

Under the city's parking lot ordinance, the remaining 25 have a right to appeal to a special board according to Building Inspector Andrew Butt, who must enforce the ordinance.

Butt said failure to permanently surface and properly drain the off-street parking areas could bring a \$100 fine, under the ordinance's terms.

To Light Skiers

Lighting for the recreation department's beginning ski slope and toboggan slide near the disposal plant will be installed this winter through a \$400 donation from the Junior chamber of commerce. City commissioners Monday night approved the installation, requesting that the city engineering department review the plans.
