**LABOR DAY PAINS**

Now that the pleasant interlude of summer has almost come to an end, and the RESTLESS ONES are returning to their various places of learning, we solemnly suggest that you turn your attention to that sadly neglected lawn. Being able to personally attest that our lawn, after a season of rough wear, caused by the passage of many feet, endeavoring to, (and succeeding in) defeating me at croquet, badminton, etc., needs a good shot in the arm... said shot being a full feeding of the following:

GRO-SOD  
 STADLER'S XXX  
 AGRICO 10-6-4

To this impressive list may we add another fine fertilizer... Not altogether new however, since we have had it since last spring. After checking the results with some of those who have used it (properly, that is) we find that the AGRICO with urea-form nitrogen, has given lawns a longer, more continuous feeding than other comparable fertilizers.

The disturbing influence of CRAB-GRASS has been felt throughout an area north of Norfolk, Va. and east of the Rocky Mts. It most certainly has made its presence known in our town. By this time you have probably killed all the plants, but before you fertilize and reseed, take a quick peek at what's left out there and if you see any new sprouts kill 'em-quick with:

CRAB-NOT... Applied wet  
 SODAR... Applied wet  
 VAUGHAN'S KO... Applied with spreader

Methods a little explanation is due to one and all concerning grass seed prices.

Any inexpensive mixture of seed is made up primarily of quick growing temporary grasses that may live a year or two. Beyond that point, they begin to deteriorate and weeds will soon infest the lawn area. The better mixtures are composed of at least sixty percent of perennial turf-forming grasses and contain not more than a small percentage of the temporary quick-growing grasses. Temporary grasses are easy to grow, produce large quantities of seed, and are usually low priced. Conversely, the perennial turf-forming grasses are not so easy to produce and are more costly to harvest and clean. This is the basic reason for the difference in price... So now you know.
