Peoples the world over practice the Golden Rule—"Do unto others as you would have them do unto you". If you traveled around the world studying the different faiths, you probably find their lives based around the Golden Rule, each with the same meaning, but worded differently.

BAHAISM—A universal religion that teaches the oneness of mankind and the independent search for truth. The religion started in Persia around the 18th century.
 "If you look toward justice, choose for others that which you choose for yourself".

BUDDHISM—Contrary to popular belief Buddhism started in India around 500 B.C., by Gautama Buddha who believed "the secret of life is love". Not till the sixth century did it reach Japan.
 "One should seek for others the happiness one desires for one's self".

CHRISTIANITY—The religion established by Jesus Christ about A.D. 65. From its birth in old Palestine, it spread around the world. There are more than five million Christians in the world.
 "Therefore, all things whatsoever ye would that men should do to you, do ye even so to them".

CONFUCIANISM—Confucius died in 478 B.C., practically unknown, but as time went on Confucianism became the religion in China around the third century B.C. His teachings made devotion to one's parents, learning and love to be the laws of life.
 "What you would not wish done to yourself do not to others".

HINDUISM—Or Brahmanism started about 100 B.C. One of the great religions of the world, it is the faith of over two million Hindus. In India the priests are called Brahmins.
 "The true rule is to do by the things of others as you do by your own".

ISLAM—The name applied by Mohammedans to their religion. It is the chief religion of Arabia, Africa and part of India.
 "Let none of you treat a brother in a way he himself would dislike to be treated".

JUDAISM—The Hebrew Prophets are the real founders of the religion known as Judaism. Started around 700 B.C. in Jerusalem, the religion spread throughout the country by 600 B.C.
 "Whatever you do not wish your neighbor to do to you do not unto him".

SHINTOISM—The "way of the Gods" is the ancient religious cult of Japan, the least developed of all national religions. Having no supreme deity and no moral code. Its central feature was sun worship.
 "Do unto others as you would be done by".

ZOROASTRIANISM—Founded by a prophet known as Zoroaster about 1000 B.C. in Iran. Today the religion has more than one hundred thousand followers, most of them living in Bombay, India.
 "Do as you would be done by".
