Passes Examination, To Receive CPS Keys

Mrs. Henry Palubin, 1834 Graefield, received notification this week from the Institute for Certifying Secretaries that she has successfully passed all six sections of the examination sponsored by The National Secretaries Association (International). The title of Certified Professional Secretary makes her a member of a select group of top-level secretaries.

The certifying examination is given nationally on the first Friday and Saturday in May each year. It covers secretarial procedures, human relations, stenography, business law, and business administration and economics.

The first examination was given in 1951, and the total number of secretaries throughout the country who had been certified as of 1956 was 983. Last year only six secretaries from the Detroit area achieved the title. There are no statistics yet available on the results of the 1957 examination.

THE DETROIT Transcript chapter of the National Secretaries Association (International) will hold a special award dinner in October for the purpose of awarding their certificates and CPS keys to those secretaries from the Detroit area who received the title in 1957.

Mrs. Palubin is currently employed as secretary to the chairman of the board of the Eclipse CounterBore company, Ferndale. Before accepting this position two years ago, she was accountant-secretary for Swanson Associates, Inc., Architects, Bloomfield Hills, for four years.

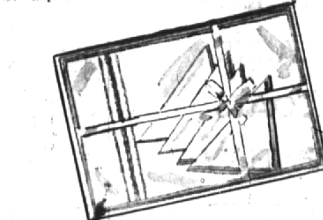

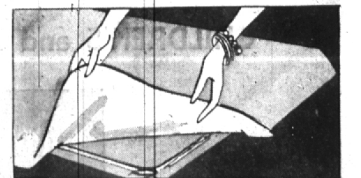

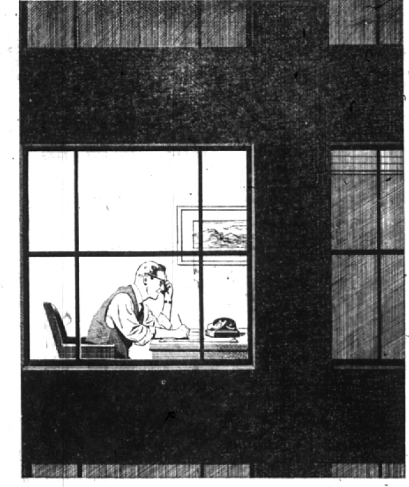
