Will Air Landfill Dispute at Hearing

TROY — Troy's running feud with the Southeastern Oakland county garbage and rubbish authority over a landfill site in the city will be taken up at a public hearing Dec. 16.

The hearing gets under way at 7:30 p.m. at Troy high school, 3179 Livermore.

A request for the hearing was made before the city council at its Monday night meeting by Donald C. Egbert, authority engineer-manager.

Egbert hopes that an amicable solution may be reached to the problem or "how best to present the matter to the courts."

THE LANDFILL site is a gravel pit on Square Lake road between Rochester and John R. Citizens of the area have protested the pit's use as a landfill and city council has voted not to let the authority use it for such a purpose.

The authority dumped a few loads of landfill at the site recently but stopped when it was ticketed by Troy for allegedly violating city ordinances.

Chicago Police Arrest Robber Of 2 Homes Here

A man believed to be the burglar who stole furs, jewelry and cameras from two Birmingham homes last June was arrested by Chicago police Tuesday night.

He is Paul Risner, 39, originally of Cincinnati. Risner was implicated in the burglaries after some of the stolen items were found in the home of a relative in Hazel Park.

Det. Lt. Merin Holmquist said Risner has been connected with the burglaries at the home of Robert Conroy, 797 Glenhurst, and the adjoining residence of Howard Vaughan, 765 Glenhurst, while the families were away last June 26.

Holmquist said Risner is expected to waive extradition, that he has a long record of previous arrests, and is wanted by police in Bloomfield Hills, Bloomfield township, and several other cities, along with Chicago.
