**Police Discover
Former B'ham Man
Fatally Wounded**

Police discovered the body of a 56-year-old man, fatally wounded by the firing of a 12 gauge shotgun, lying between two cars at 636 South Woodward, Birmingham, at 5 a.m. Sunday.

The man was Glen Albert Gravin of Royal Oak, formerly of Birmingham. He had formerly been a surveyor for the McAlpine Map Co., of Birmingham, with offices near the spot where his body was found. A nearby resident told police she heard a shot about 8 p.m. the night before.

Police said Gravin left a note in his pocket addressed to his former wife, from whom he was divorced Nov. 12. Other notes were to his son, William G. Gravin, police, Oakland County Prosecutor Fred Ziem, and a member of the McAlpine firm.

BORN IN BIRMINGHAM, June 25, 1901, he moved to Royal Oak 17 years ago. At the present time he was a surveyor for Nerec Alix, Mr. Gravin was a member of St. James Episcopal church in Birmingham.

He leaves his son, William G. of Clawson, and two brothers, Clyde and Hugh of Royal Oak.
Services were Tuesday from the Manly Bailey funeral home with burial in Franklin cemetery.

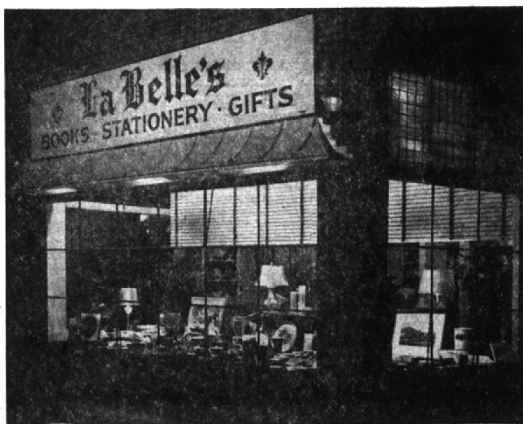
