Right in Middle Of Mud Muddle Are the PTA's

It's up to the school PTA organization in Birmingham to decide whether to get into the mud muddle of education to accept less than permanent-type improvement between walk and curbs. Otherwise school children will have to continue for some time to walk from car to sidewalk through mud and puddles. The decision came Monday night after Birmingham city commissioners deliberated for better than 30 minutes on who can help or what can be done to eliminate the muddy feet.

EXPOSITION OF less mud is Commissioner Florence Willett, who for months has tried to help mothers and kiddies walk on dried mud.

Targets of this dry campaign are the Taunton entrance at Torrey school, Chesterfield approach to Quorton school, and Purdy road at Barrum junior high. City Manager L. R. Gare reported that conferences with school officials have brought out that the school board doesn't want to put money into anything that is not permanent.

THIS WOULD mean curbs, gutter and paving, the city commissioner explained Monday night. "But it is agreed that residents—particularly near Quorton—have vigorously resisted these pavings, and they probably are some years away yet," Mrs. Willett was quick to acknowledge.

"But there must be some semi-permanent kind of improvement that can be made."

Commissioners then decided that it, too, was not interested in solving the problem on a semi-permanent basis if the school board was not.

"Guess it's now up to the PTAs to get the school board to accept something less than a permanent improvement," Mayor William E. Roberts summed up.

3 Physicians Are Chiefs of Staff At St. Joseph's

By 1960, three Birmingham physicians will have served as chief of staff in three years at St. Joseph's Mercy hospital, Pontiac. The hospital staff elected Dr. Norman E. Gehring, of 400 Yarrowmouth, to the position of president elect, at its annual meeting Tuesday night. Dr. Robert J. Mason, of 564 Overhill, was installed as new chief of staff for the year 1957, and Dr. Robert Wessels, of 2152 Tottenham, retired as 1957 chief of staff. Dr. Gehring will automatically become chief of staff for 1959.

of having to hold hearings on whether X property should be changed to Y or not," Herzberg said. He said the board plans to consider the few minor zoning map changes at a later date, after adoption of the new law.

AMONG CHANGES NOW dropped from the law are the rezoning of eight lots on the northeast corner of Elm and Bowers, three of which were sought by Harvey Turner, for storage purposes, and the rezoning of three lots at Lincoln and Ann, near Bell greenhouses, from business A to income bungalow.

Most of the changes involved "transitional" property between business and residential zones. In compliance with requests from owners of several city buildings, the board is considering raising the maximum building height to six stories, instead of the present four.

PLAN BOARD MEMBER Elliot F. Robinson objected, suggesting that two six-story buildings built opposite each other on a narrow street would create the atmosphere of a metropolis. The board is giving the matter further study.

At a meeting last week Wednesday the board adopted a number of changes suggested for the law by local real estate men, including zoning minimum lot area required for apartment dwellings, and permitting department stores in the B-2 district, comparable to the present business A zone.
