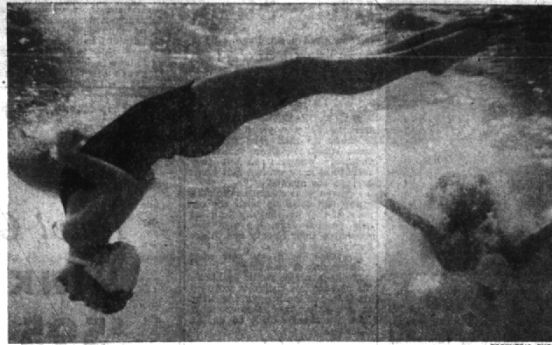
The various scholarship averages for the first quarter, marking period have been worked out and the whole school average was found to be 76.50.
