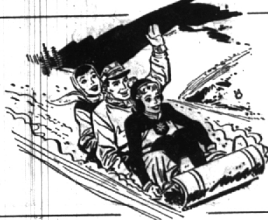

With them were their son, Bill, Mrs. VanDike's sister, Miss Betty Schultz and her friend, Kay Bebiel.

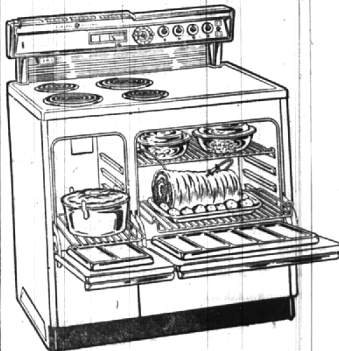
With them they took a frozen turkey so for Thanksgiving, they were prepared and had a turkey dinner and all the trimmings. Young Bill got the only deer.

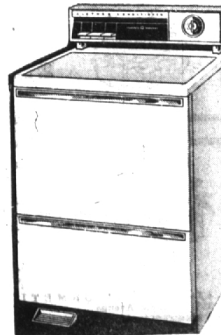
