Fire Chief Warns Of Holiday Hazards

It is the night before Christmas . . . but not everyone

It is the night before Christmas ... out not everyone sleeps.

In fire stations in Birmingham and throughout the country there's an air of uneasy tension. And for a good reason.

Fires at Christmas time are particularly tragic. On the most sentimental day, thousands of homes and apartments are carelessly converted into dangerous fire traps.

TWO YEARS AGO fires on Christmas eve killed 23 persons, most of them children. And in the four-day villetide weekend last year, fires claimed the lives of Ed policy for the persons of the service of the ones of the service of the ones you love. The Christmas tree is a potential fire hazard and caution should be taken in its selection, placement in the home and maintenance.

(1) Play safe by choosing a small tree. Keep it outdoors until ready to set up.

(2) WHEN YOU bring the tree inside, cut the butt slantwise to open the pores. Then stand it in a tub of water or moist earth.

(3) In placing the tree, it's best to lavoid "hot spots" such as those near the fireplace, television set or radiators.

(4) Never use untreated cotton batting for decorations. Cotton can be made flame-resistant latter treatment by dipping in a gallon of warm water mixed with nine ounces of borax and four ounces of boric acid.

(5) BE SURE, too, that Christmas tree light cords are in good condition. Frayed electric cords are a fire hazard. Never use an outlet or plug under the tree or run electric trains around the base.

(6) Keep plenty of farge ash trays handy during the holiday season, as always.

(7) If lights are desired in windows, never use candles. Keep curtains and other flammable materials pulled back at least six inches from electric lights.

(8). AFTER YOU have opened your Christmas presents, remove all the gift wrappings and packing materials from your living room and dispose of them.

(9) Adults should take care also in purchasing chemical sets for children. Toys requiring alcohol, kerosene, gasoline or carbide may be hazardous in juvenile hands.
