

Towering Holly Center Too Much for Hills

Sinks 23, Controls Rebounds

HOLLY—George McDaniel makes good use of his size. The 6-foot-6-inch Holly pivot proved too much for Bloomfield Hills as he was capable of handling here Friday night. He dunked 23 points, took nearly all the rebounds of both bands and in general, fronted the Holly attack that breezed by the Barons, 70 to 49.

Holly got off to a 23-11 first quarter edge and was never threatened. It was 41 to 23 at halftime and 53 to 33 at the close of the third period.

THE TOWERING Bronco center scored eight field goals and added seven charity tosses for his impressive total. Two teammates hit double figures—Amos Bradsher netting 18 and Harold Kinney 10. Bob Barrett's 13 points was high for Bloomfield Hills. Jim Townsend added 11 for the Barons.

THE NEW ski resort is equipped with eight tows and a snow-making machine. The area is lighted for night skiing and a new lodge is ready for the opening.

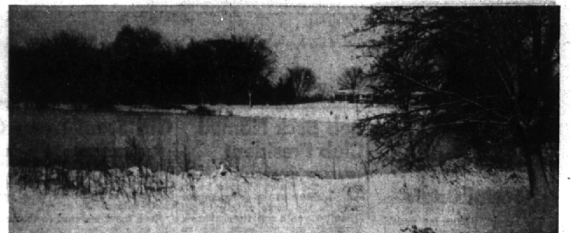
