To the Editor: Eleven years is a long time but a dream come true can be a short one to the Birmingham YMCA. At a reception in November of 1946, Edwin F. Kirker then newly appointed Executive Secretary of the Birmingham branch of the Metropolitan Detroit YMCA stated that he would do everything in his power to see that a comprehensive building was built in Birmingham. The fulfillment of a part of the dream came true last Sunday in the breaking of ground for the first unit of the 'Y' structure. This will be joined to the present frame building that has housed the 'Y' offices since 1932.

AN AGREEMENT with the Metropolitan Detroit building fund prevents the local organization from having a campaign for funds to help carry the load. An allocation of \$100,000 was received from this group, leaving approximately \$44,000 to be raised by the local organization among friends and members to complete this first picture.

Many Birminghamites had no part in the erection of the first structure and likewise did not contribute to the MDDF campaign. Would it not be a fitting gesture for everyone to remember the Bir-
