**Troy Voters Get One Tax Limit Choice, Not Two**

**TROY** — When Troy voters go to the polls Jan. 20, 1958 they will only be allowed to vote on one tax limitation proposition, instead of two as originally planned. The ballot for the special election was scheduled to carry proposals letting the voters decide whether they want the city's tax limitation dropped from 15 to 8 or to 5 mills. But the 5 mill limit has been ordered stricken from the ballot by Thomas M. Kavanagh, state attorney general, on grounds the proposal was approved 10 days too late by the city commission.

**KAVANAGH SAID** 60 days must pass between the time the proposal is approved and the date of the election. The special election stems from a petition presented by a citizen's group asking that the limitation be cut from its present 15 mill top. Residents also will vote on a proposal to change certain election provisions of the city charter.

**To Check Records Before Approving Park Ordinance**

Before passing a new park ordinance, Birmingham city officials are going to make a search of city records. They want to know how much public property has been officially

dedicated for park purposes. They also want the city attorney to advise whether only "designating" public property as parks might in some way hamper future disposition. "Dedicated" property must be voted on by the public. Public property being used for park or recreational purposes, and only "designated" as such, normally requires but city commission approval for its use. The new ordinance would give the city manager power to set rules for park use. One pound of evaporated milk uses 2.2 pounds of milk.
